RESOLUTION NO. 1 Dedication of Convention and Declaration of Principles

WHEREAS, the Iowa State Council of the Knights of Columbus is in session at the 120th Annual Meeting pursuant to the Constitution and Bylaws of the Order, and

WHEREAS, the Iowa State Council of the Knights of Columbus meets in the desire that its deliberations will arouse greater interest and perpetuate greater areas of apostolic and socially aware activities by members of the Order, and

WHEREAS, as the Knights of Columbus should work in a unified and efficient manner toward strengthening a more just society for the benefit of the church, community, members and all people, and

WHEREAS, as citizens of the United States of America, we turn for intercession to our Blessed Mother under the title of the Immaculate Conception and to Our Lady of Guadalupe as patroness of the Americas.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the lowa State Council of the Knights of Columbus, duly assembled at this 120th Annual Meeting, humbly dedicate its deliberations to the improvement of society according to Catholic Christian principles and in so deliberating on all resolutions utilizes the principles of wisdom, patience and fraternal charity to promote the common good according to Catholic Christian principles in union with Jesus our Savior and Mary our Holy Mother, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the members of the lowa State Council of the Knights of Columbus reaffirm the following declarations of purposes as espoused within the Charter of the Knights of Columbus to render pecuniary aid to members and their families; to render mutual aid and assistance to sick, disabled and needy members and their families; to promote social and intellectual intercourse among members and their families; and to promote and conduct educational work, charitable work, religious work, social welfare, war relief, and welfare, and public relief work.

RESOLUTION NO. 2 Beatification of Blessed Michael J. McGivney

WHEREAS, Father Michael Joseph McGivney was a parish priest in New Haven, Connecticut in 1882 when he enlisted the aid of others to establish an organization for the purpose of (i) rendering mutual aid and assistance to its sick, disabled, and needy members and their families, and (ii) for the promotion of the social and intellectual intercourse among members and their families, and (iii) promoting and conducting educational, charitable, religious, social welfare and relief work, and

WHEREAS, the Order is the embodiment of Fr. McGivney's vision, fulfilling its purpose of charity and evangelization, and

WHEREAS, Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI recognized the heroic virtues of Fr. McGivney, advancing the Vatican's process towards his sainthood and giving him the distinction of being a "Venerable Servant of God." and

WHEREAS, the Vatican has confirmed the miracle brought upon through the intercession of Father Michael McGivney healing the preborn Mikey Schachle of a life-threatening condition, paving the way for Father McGivney's Beautification, and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Iowa State Council of the Knights of Columbus hereby prays that Father Michael J. McGivney will soon be numbered among God's saints, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that during one session of this and subsequent annual business meetings of the State Council the Prayer for the Canonization of Blessed Fr. Michael J. McGivney shall be prayed by those in attendance, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that upon passage of this resolution by the Iowa State Council of the Knights of Columbus at the 120th Annual Meeting, that the same be presented for consideration by delegates to the 2021 Supreme Council Meeting.

RESOLUTION NO. 10 Salutation and Appreciation of Convention Host Committee

WHEREAS, this 2021 State Convention of the Iowa State Council of the Knights of Columbus has been hosted by a committee of Knights and their wives from local councils in the Sioux City area, chaired by brother Knights Dennis Kluver and John Staiert, and

WHEREAS, dozens of brother Knights, together with their wives, have worked very hard and have been very gracious in their hospitality extended to the attendees of this 2021 State Convention, and

WHEREAS, the 2020 State Convention was planned to be hosted in Sioux City before it was held virtually due to COVID-19.

RESOLUTION NO. 11 In Remembrance of departed brother Knights and those enrolled in the Perpetual Memorial Society

WHEREAS, the Iowa State Council of the Knights of Columbus is deeply grateful for the many contributions of its members, and

WHEREAS, the Iowa State Council of the Knights of Columbus wishes to pause and remember those brother Knights from its councils who have concluded their service to the Order and to their Church through falling asleep in the hope of eternal life, and

WHEREAS, the Iowa State Council of the Knights of Columbus established the Perpetual Memorial Society in 1990 to provide a means for an eternal remembrance for those departed brothers and sisters in Christ and encourages all to enroll those recently departed.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Iowa State Council of the Knights of Columbus, duly assembled at this 120th Annual Meeting, do hereby express its sincere appreciation and thanks for their splendid service to our Order, our Holy Mother Church, and their local communities through the virtues of charity, unity, fraternity, and patriotism, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that those duly assembled at the 120th Annual Meeting of the lowa State Council shall remember these departed brother Knights, all enrollees of the Perpetual Memorial Society, and those from our families who have recently departed through the participation at the annual Memorial Mass conducted during the 2021 State Convention.

RESOLUTION NO. 12 Supporting a Culture of Life

WHEREAS, the Iowa Knights of Columbus has always held steadfast support for a Culture of Life, and

WHEREAS, the Catholic Bishops of Iowa support the protection of life from conception until natural death, and

WHEREAS, the Iowa Catholic Conference, with the support of many Iowans, asks the legislature to stop the use and trafficking of fetal body parts resulting from abortion and to retain Iowa's law rejecting doctor-prescribed suicide and euthanasia.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Iowa State Council of the Knights of Columbus and its members lend their prayers and support for a Culture of Life, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the lowa Knights of Columbus will encourage its members, their families, and parishes in lowa to be and remain involved in communicating with their elected officials, gathering information from the lowa Catholic Conference's website and through its Legislature Network, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that upon passage of this resolution by the Iowa State Council of the Knights of Columbus at the 120th Annual Meeting, that the same be presented for consideration by delegates to the 2021 Supreme Council Meeting.

RESOLUTION NO. 13 Supporting Racial Equality

WHEREAS, the Knights of Columbus was founded with a framework to support membership drawn from the broadest possible diversity of practicing Catholic men and was, at the time of its founding, the only American fraternal society that did not prohibit membership on the basis of race; and

WHEREAS, one of the Order's original incorporators, Supreme Secretary Daniel Colwell, described a purpose of the Knights of Columbus to be a social and fraternal organization that would "unify American Catholic citizens of every national and racial origin...giving scope and purpose to their aims as Catholics and as Americans;" and

WHEREAS, the Order's commitment to racial diversity was substantially expressed in 1905 with the establishment of the Knights of Columbus in Mexico—paving the way for expansion into the Philippines less than a decade later and continued growth throughout the world; and

WHEREAS, during World War I, the Knights of Columbus hospitality huts were the only integrated facilities available to troops advertising such with their well-known motto, "Everybody Welcome. Everything Free;" and

WHEREAS, in the 1920s and 1930s, the Knights of Columbus banded together with African American, Jewish, and other minority communities to combat the evil actions and propaganda of the Ku Klux Klan leading the Klan to specifically cite the Order as "the organization most interested in [its] destruction;" and

WHEREAS, when it became known that some councils were preventing African American men from joining the Order in violation of the Constitution, Laws, and Rules, the delegates to the 82nd Supreme Convention held in 1964 amended the bylaws to "remove forever the opportunity of prejudice" in admissions, and

WHEREAS, in June 2020, the Knights of Columbus asked all people to come together in solidarity to forge a path forward free of discrimination and hate by calling for a Novena for National Unity and an End to Racism; and

WHEREAS, in August of 2020, the delegates to the 138th Supreme Council meeting adopted, by unanimous consent, a resolution calling for the end of segregation and demoralization of peoples based on their racial background, and

WHEREAS, Pope Francis has been clear that, "We cannot tolerate or turn a blind eye to racism and exclusion in any form and yet claim to defend the sacredness of every human life".

NOW, **THEREFORE**, **BE IT RESOLVED** that the lowa State Council of the Knights of Columbus and its members emphatically supports an end to racial inequality of all types, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that we take to heart the words of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. that "injustice anywhere, is a threat to justice everywhere," by pledging to continue supporting projects that create opportunity for people of all races, ethnicities, and backgrounds; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the lowa Knights of Columbus will encourage its members, their families, and parishes in lowa to be and remain involved in communicating with their elected officials, gathering information, and communicating through the Legislature Network of the lowa Catholic Conference, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that upon passage of this resolution by the lowa State Council of the Knights of Columbus at the 120th Annual Meeting, that the same be presented for consideration by delegates to the 2021 Supreme Council Meeting.
